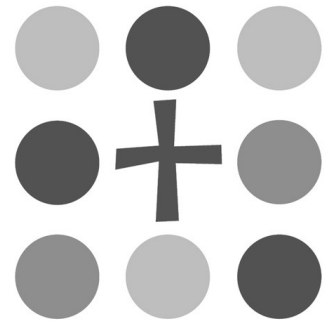

# ***Feasting on Jesus***



*Dear Friends*

We are rapidly approaching a time of year when parties, feasts and festivities are the norm for many of us: Christmas dinner, the works' "Christmas do", mince pies, mulled wine, roasted chestnuts and so on. The Church is no stranger to feasting; our medieval forebears living as monks and nuns invented the idea of a religious feast or festival every so often, to give relief from their regular, somewhat plain, diet. Like us they relished the opportunity to have a special meal in celebration of something or someone. And Christmas Day is of course one such feast day. So we celebrate Christmas with a special dinner, not forgetting the pudding of course. On Boxing Day, full of turkey and the trimmings, beans on toast may well be the order of the day. But Boxing Day is also a day of celebration. It is St Stephen's day, a festival in the church calendar. In the Bible, Stephen is described as one of seven deacons (servants) whose job it was to care for widows in the early church in Jerusalem. He was a committed follower of Jesus who became a martyr for his beliefs. It may seem odd to have a festival devoted to a man who died for his faith but we do because he did. Throughout history men and women have followed in his steps and still do today, as our newspapers and TVs tell us. We are thankful for all Christian men and women who have made that sacrifice to enable us to freely worship Jesus, and to celebrate our Christian faith so publicly; that's why we have a festival for St Stephen. At the heart of this festival and all of our feasts is Jesus, Emmanuel (which means "God with us"). So as you share your Christmas dinners, your parties with families and friends, and eat beans on toast on Boxing Day, enjoy it and rejoice in God who loves us so much that he came to live among us in his only Son, Jesus Christ whose birth we celebrate each year on Christmas Day.

## **Posada – Making Room for Jesus this Christmas**

### **What is Posada?**

Posada is an old Mexican tradition where young people dressed as Mary and Joseph travel from house to house asking for a room for the night. On Christmas Eve they would visit the local church to re-enact the nativity and place figures of Mary and Joseph in a crib.

Modern day Posada in Britain uses nativity figures of Mary and Joseph who travel from place to place. This gives each 'host' the chance to create their own simple celebration in their home or place in the community, making room for Jesus in their lives.



The Wiverton Group of Churches has chosen to engage with Posada this year. Will you be a host to Mary and Joseph for a night?

### **What is involved?**

All you need to do is add your name and 'phone number to the Journey Rota for a night that will suit you to 'host' Mary & Joseph. Make a note of the name and 'phone number on the date above your own and contact that person about a suitable time to pick up or receive Mary and Joseph. The Rotas are in each of the Wiverton Group Churches (except St. Mary's Barnstone).

During the evening that you 'host' Mary & Joseph you can choose to do whatever you like. You could have some 'quiet' time in the midst of preparation for Christmas or why not invite friends and family to sing carols and to talk about the meaning of Christmas? We have a special Posada board game that should keep the children involved and most importantly there are prayers both for the work of Church Army in Britain and for life here and abroad.

The next day you pass Mary & Joseph on to the next host on the Journey Rota.

It's as simple as that.
