## THE ALPHA COURSE

### *What is Alpha?*

The Alpha course is an opportunity for anyone to explore the Christian faith. It's relaxed, non-threatening, low key, friendly and fun.

## THE MARRIAGE COURSE

How to build a healthy marriage that lasts a lifetime.

### *What is The Marriage Course?*

The Marriage Course is very practical, giving any married couple the tools to build a strong and healthy marriage that lasts a lifetime.

Topics covered include: recognising each other's needs, learning to communicate effectively, resolving conflict, healing past hurt, knowing how to make each other feel loved, relating to parents and in-laws, good sex, making time for each other and having fun together.

Privacy as a couple is always respected. There is no group discussion and no requirement to disclose anything about your relationship to anyone else.

### ***What's involved?***

Each evening begins with a candlelit meal. There is then a talk followed by an opportunity to discuss the topic together as a couple.

The setting is welcoming, relaxed and unthreatening.

### ***Who is it for?***

- ◆ The Marriage Course is for any married couple who want to build a strong and lasting relationship, especially:
- ◆ those who want to enhance their marriage
- ◆ those in the first five years of marriage
- ◆ those at a challenging stage in their marriage e.g. the birth of a child, a career
- ◆ change, teenagers at home, the 'empty nest'
- ◆ those struggling with issues in their marriage.

The course, while based on Christian principles, is very helpful for any couple with or without a Christian faith or church background.
